Early Entrance to Kindergarten Information Packet

Spencer County Public Schools Early Admission to Kindergarten

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The first year for primary school for Spencer County Public Schools (SCPS) begins with students who turn age five on or before August 1st. In accordance with KRS 158.031(6), SCPS has established criteria for early entrance to Primary 1(Pl), also known as kindergarten, for students who have mastered Pl benchmarks before age five. Students who turn five years old between August 2nd and October 1st will be eligible to enroll provided that the student meets criteria established by the Board of Education

Criteria for Early Entrance (Pl)

- 1. Child be a resident of Spencer County, Kentucky; and
- 2. Child must turn five between August 2nd and October 1st of the admission year; and
- 3. Score at or above the 90th percentile on the Brigance Kindergarten Screen III core assessments, self-help and social-emotional scales; and
- 4. Score at or above the 90th percentile on the AIMSWEB Early Literacy and Early Numeracy Probes.

The Early Admissions Committee will make a decision based on the information collected above for early entrance. This decision will be sent to you, in writing, within two weeks of your child's assessment.

If you are interested in applying for admission for the upcoming school year, please complete and return the following items to the Spencer County Board of Education, 207 Main Street, Taylorsville KY. 40071. This information must be provided by April 1st in the year of enrollment in order to be considered.

- 1. Petition for Early Entrance to Pl
- 2. Consent to Screen/Evaluate for Early Entrance to Pl
- 3. Skills Checklist for Early Entrance (to be completed by a preschool or daycare provider)
- 4. Social Developmental History

Early Admission to P1 (Kindergarten)

The first year for Primary school for Spencer County Public Schools begins with students who turn age 5 on or before August 1st of the upcoming school year. In accordance with KRS 158.031(6), SCPS has established criteria for early entrance to Primary 1(P1), also known as kindergarten, for students who have mastered P1 benchmarks before age 5. Students who turn 5 years old between August 2nd and October 1st will be eligible to enroll provided that the student meets criteria established by the Spencer County Board of Education.

Criteria for Early Entrance (P1)

- · Child must be a resident of Spencer County, Kentucky: and
- Child must turn 5 between August 2 and October 1st of the admission year: and
- Child must score at or above the 90th percentile on the BRIGANCE
 Kindergarten Screen III core assessments, self-help, and social-emotional
 scales: and
- Child must score at or above the 90th percentileon the AIMSWEB Early Literacy and Early Numeracy probes.

Early Admission to School Things to Consider



The following page is intended to help parents determine the appropriateness of having their child evaluated for entrance into Primary 1 (Kindergarten) ahead of schedule.

SHOULD I HAVE MY CHILD EVALUATED?

Parents are advised to give this question serious thought before registering their child for an early entrance evaluation. School entrance can be an anxiety provoking situation that should not be taken lightly. Each school experience shapes self-confidence and influences children for the rest of their lives.

Child development at ages four and five is often not even. Thus, a four year old may appear advanced because of large vocabulary and language development while social skills may be typical of the child's age. At times an extra year of preschool development may provide a better shills profile and greater assurance of school success.

But, for very few children, early entrance to P1 will be exactly what the child needs. In these cases, registration should be considered only if the child appears to be working at or above the 90th percentile in each of the following areas: social, emotional, and intellectual development.

WHAT'S NEXT?

If, after careful consideration, you decide that your child may be one of the very few who will benefit from early admission, you will need to return the completed forms and an assessment will be scheduled.

Early Entrance to P1 Frequently Asked Questions

Why does my child need to meet certain requirements to be considered for early admission?

KRS 158.030 provides for any child who is five (5) years of age, or who may become five (5) years of age by August 1, may enter a primary school program, as defined in KRS 158.031, and may advance through the primary program without regard to age in accordance with KRS 158.031(6).

The Early Admission Policy is an amendment to KRS 158.030 requiring each local school board to adopt a policy for parents or guardians to petition the board to enroll a child who does not meet the Pl age requirement of turning 5 years of age on or before August 1.

You are petitioning for early school admission and must meet the requirements determined by the Spencer County Board of Education.

What are the requirements?

A child must be a resident of Spencer County, Kentucky; and score at or above the 90th percentile in the areas of core assessments, self-help scale and social-emotional scales on the Brigance Kindergarten Screen III assessment. If a student meets that threshold, the student must then score at or above the 90th percentile on the AIMSWEB Early Literacy and Early Numeracy probes to qualify for early admission to Pl. In addition, the parents are required to complete and return the petition for early admission, a skills checklist and a social developmental history form.

What does scoring at or above the 90th percentile mean?

A percentile takes the raw score (number of correct responses) and evaluates it in comparison to the scores of other children who are the same age. When compared to a 100 children who were administered the test, a child who scored at or above the 90th percentile did better than 90 of them.

Who will administer the assessments?

All Assessments will be administered by SCPS certified teacher.

What skills are assessed on these assessments and how long does the screening take? Children are screened with the Core Assessments. While the student is being screened, parents complete a survey of self-help and social-emotional skills. On average, the assessment appointment takes 60 minutes.

Where will the screening be conducted?

The screening will take place at the Spencer County Preschool building.

How will the results be reported to parents?

Parents will receive a letter with the results of the assessment.

Do the test results become part of my child's school record?

If the student is accepted under the early admission policy, the results will be forwarded to the assigned school.

Can my child be retested or is there an appeal procedure?

The assessments will only be given one time and there is not an appeal procedure.

Is my child guaranteed a particular school?

The district policy states that students must attend the school within the designated boundaries in which they live. Waivers can be requested of the Superintendent but will only be granted in extreme situations. Transportation can't be guaranteed as part of a waiver request.

Will bus transportation be provided?

Your child will be entitled to transportation like all Pl students. Your child will be on the bus with other elementary students.

Are there before and after school childcare programs?

SCPS does provide a before and after-school childcare program. Bear Care is facilitated in much the same manner as most childcare centers and does have a cost associated with this service. Contact Allyson Berry, Bear Care Director, at 1-502-477-3273 for more information.

What if English is not the primary language for the student?

A child will be screened in his/her primary language, which is the language that is spoken at home. Interpreters and/or translators may be used to help screen English Language Learners. In some cases, the basic screening may be given in one language and the Self-help/Social emotional Scale is provided to a parent/guardian in another language to meet the individual needs of the family.

What if I change my mind about early entrance to P1?

An entry level student in the primary program can be withdrawn from school during the first two months of school due to immaturity by mutual agreement of the parent, guardian or other custodian and the school inaccordance with 704 KARS:06
